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

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Spotlighting top young professionals

here continues to be a talent war in Connecticut as employers compete for top performers amid a tight labor market.

Up-and-coming young professionals remain a key recruitment focus for companies. While Connecticut struggles at times to retain newly-minted college graduates, the state still has a strong cohort of young professionals making a difference at their respective organizations and within the broader community.

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Anthony Anthony is the chief marketing officer for Connecticut, spearheading the charge to revitalize the state's brand and reputation as a world-class place to live, work and play.

Since being appointed in March 2023, he has rebranded the state and driven high-water marks for positive public relations mentions of CT (4.1 billion), hits to CT Visit (9.4 million, making it a top 10 state tourism website), and visitors to the state (67.9 million) in 2023.

What's been your biggest professional accomplishment so far in your career?

Rebranding the state of Connecticut and creating a meaningful campaign around it to put the state on the map again. This required strategic insights, creativity, collaboration with numerous partners, and a great deal of buy-in from internal and external stakeholders to maximize impact both in-state and out-of-state.

How are you involved in the community?

As a state official, I have the pleasure of working closely with our municipalities, residents, nonprofits and many businesses every day. While I'm not originally from Connecticut, I've fallen in love with it because of the people. There's an immense sense of community here, with dedication to common objectives wherever you go.

- Doubled the team size of two state offices, integrating tourism and economic development marketing to create the Office of Statewide Marketing & Tourism.
- Served as a strategic advisor to Fortune 500 CEOs, nonprofit executives and the governor of Connecticut.



Heather Atkins is a certified financial planner (CFP) at Johnson Brunetti and has onboarded 330 families, bringing in approximately \$150 million in investments.

She is currently servicing over 400 families in all areas of financial planning. Atkins made it her mission to empower women to find financial freedom and success. She wants to get more money in the hands of women, and she has positioned herself as a mentor for other women and men to do the same.

What's been your biggest professional accomplishment so far in your career?

I spent years preparing and studying to obtain my CFP certification. I have been able to change the lives of my clients because of this certification, and that is something I will always be proud of.

How are you involved in the community?

I have been an active member, fundraiser and participant in the Junior League of Hartford for four years. I served as the community service co-chair and assisted the board as treasurer. I am also an active volunteer for Dress for Success, Junior Achievement, and the Boys and Girls Club.


What's been your biggest professional accomplishment so far in your career?

How are you involved in the community?



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Matthew Gelles serves as president and CEO of NEFCO, a 1,000-plus employee construction supply distributor throughout the United States. He is responsible for NEFCO's strategic, financial and operational execution with oversight over all of NEFCO's departments. Since Gelles joined NEFCO in 2010, revenues have grown by 18x and profitability has grown by 28x.

What's been your biggest professional accomplishment so far in your career?


My biggest professional accomplishment has been leading the execution of the comprehensive strategic plan I drafted in 2012, to take our family's regional construction distribution business from 70 employees and four locations in 2012, and grow it to become a nationwide distributor, which today spans over 40 locations and over 1,000 employees.

Why do you deserve to be a 40 Under Forty?

- Took over leadership of NEFCO as president and CEO in 2022 at age 34 and have doubled both revenues and profitability in the last two years.
- · Lead strategic planning and execution, which has led to tremendous growth and transformation of our family business, from 70 employees to over 1,000 in 14 years.
- Lead strategic planning and execution, which has resulted in revenues increasing by 18x in those 14 years, making NEFCO one of the largest independent distributors across the U.S.

What do you like to do outside of work?

I enjoy spending time with my family, my wife Tracy, and sons Gabe and Jack and my extended family and friends. I am an avid sports fan and in my spare time, I enjoy playing golf, basketball, tennis, padel and basically any other sport available to me.



Matthew Gravell is the director of program finance at Electric Boat. He leads a team of 80 people responsible for cost management and financial performance across all business lines, including the Columbia-class submarine program, the nation's No. 1 defense priority.

What's been your biggest professional accomplishment so far in your career?

How are you involved in the community?



I also worked to launch the North Hartford Ascend Pipeline and North Hartford Navigation Hub, connecting families in North Hartford to resources and services.

How are you involved in the community?





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
